











Creating Flight Plans In Garmin's 430/530

Creating the needed flight plan in the GNS430/530 is fairly simple: direct to DEN. Here's how to do it:

1. Press  to bring up the Flight Plan page. Your departure point, KEGE in this case, should be the first entry. If it's not, use  to enter it. Press  to confirm KEGE and place it into the flight plan.
2. While still on the Flight Plan page, press  to bring up the procedures page. Use  to highlight "Select Departure," then press  once to load the Gypsum Three Departure Procedure.
3. To make the VNAV function work as we want, we need to enter another waypoint in our flight plan. Scroll back up to the first entry and enter "NEPRY," a fix just east of Runway 25 at EGE. Then scroll down to the "Enroute" portion of the flight plan and use  to enter "KDEN."
4. Use  to select "NEPRY." Press  twice and  once to make the leg from NEPRY to KEGE the active leg.

That's it! Your active flight plan should be NEPRY > KEGE > DBL22 > RLG > KDEN and look like the one in the sidebar on the next page.
